Dear Mr. Du Pont:

While I have not taken an active part in the discussions initiated by your series of letters last year, I am quite interested to know what progress this thought of yours has made.

As you readily admit, your proposition is not orthodox Georgism. Nevertheless any attempt to alleviate conditions of poverty by forcing land into use must be considered in the same school of thought.

Obviously the School must remain orthodox in its teachings. But, without contaminating those who are being initiated into the philosophy with variations from the central theme, we who are active in the school movement are interested in any effort along Georgist lines.

Not having received any letters from you in a long time I was wondering whether you had dropped your proposal, or whether any new developments had taken place.
