Espey Albig, secretary of the Foundation and I believe that is his title also of the American Bankers' Assn. Mr. Albig appeared very sympathetic and much interested in the work of the HGSSS. He knew Wm N. McNair of Pittsburgh before McNair was mayor; regrets McNair's failure to go through with his administration. Mr. Albig said he would like to visit the School after Thanksgiving and asked that some one from the School get in touch with him thru. Mr. Albig is an admirer of Dr. John Dewey, regarding him as an individualist rather than as a Socialist. Mr. Albig is for freedom as against paternalistic props.

Carnegie Corporation of New York, 522 Fifth Ave., Telephone VA. 3-9731. JLM saw Mr. Samuel S. Hall, Jr., Assistant to the Treasurer and Investment Officer. Mr. Hall questioned whether the Corporation would do anything for the School because (1) the School emphasizes "one school of thought" (2) the Corporation is already helping adult education work through a man who was a friend\* of the President of the Corporation. However Mr. Hall recommended going directly to the President's office and presenting the case for the School. There I was told to write a letter outlining the purposes of the School and any desired request for a grant, and at the same time suggesting an appointment with Mr. John M. Russell, assistant to the President, or with the President, Mr. Frederick P. Koppel.

When JLM called on 11-9-38, no executive was in. Was requested to call again next week to see Dr. Henry A. Atkinson, the general secretary.

She said that the Foundation did not give to any but special projects. She recommended that the School present a written request for a special project such as promotion of the correspondence course beyond what is now being done. She had no idea whether this would be the best special project that the School could suggest.

Phelps-Stokes Fund, 101 Park Avenue, N.Y.C. Telephone AS. 4-8578. JLM saw Thomas Jesse Jones, educational director, 11-9-38. Dr. Jones is favorably disposed to any work bearing the name of Henry George because of the Georgists he has known, including Dr. James H. Dillard of Charleston, Va. (address?), who is a trustee of the Phelps-Stokes Fund. Dr. Jones said that the resources of the Fund had been so greatly curtailed that it could not contribute, but he wishes to visit the School and would welcome an invitation from Mr. Dorn or some one else. He could give counsel on the different foundations.
