This League recently sent to you Henry George's
CONDITION OF LABOR; which, if you have read, has put you
in possession of the moral argument for our reform, as fully
and as completely as a master-pen could draft it.

We beg to commend herewith to your additional
thought a fiscal sequel, or accompaniment to the above, Two
Chapters (IX and XIII) from Mr. Shearman's book "Natural
Taxation." The reading of this will, it is hoped, help to
make clear to your mind three things.

First: That extraneous to the land itself, and
over and above all the things which man has made, there is
another value: the privilege value of particular situation,
which is not in any sense the product of labor.

Second: That simple justice demands that all pub-
lic revenue should be derived from ground rent.

Third: That the taking of public revenue from
ground-rent alone will result in a score of demonstrable
social benefits, and with no disadvantage to the community.
