JOHN LAWRENCE MONROE, R. I. P.
August 31, 1908 - January 23, 1988

John Lawrence Monroe died peacefully, Saturday, January 23, at Laguna Honda Hospital in San Francisco after several years illness. He had been director of the Chicago Extension of the Henry George School of Social Science from 1936 to 1968.

John's children, Jane Leslie Monroe Alsperger, Adam Jon Monroe, Jeremy Martin Monroe and Phoebe Elizabeth Monroe Schroder invite you to join them in a celebration of his life. John Monroe's sole purpose in life was to promote the economic and social philosophy of Henry George. First as aide to his father Frederick H. Monroe, founder of the Henry George Lecture Association; then with the Henry George Foundation. After the Henry George School was formed in New York in 1932, John became an associate director under Frank Chodorov. He was sent to Chicago to be Director of the Chicago Extension of HGSSS. In 1962 he founded the Institute for Economic Inquiry, which he took to San Francisco in 1968.

John Lawrence Monroe's life was an example of selfless dedication to a humane ideal. He embraced the basic morality of Henry George as well as the good sense of Georgist economics.
