Dear Judy and Robbin:

Your program last night did much to further a better understanding of the problems of poverty, homelessness and affordable housing. I know that you sought specific solutions to the problems and they were not forthcoming; unless more federal subsidies is considered a solution. Surely a wrong land policy deserves a place in the debate. In future programs that seek remedies to these problems will you consider using some of the many experts in the east that are close to you?

Close neighbors to you in New York would be George Collins, Director of the Henry George School of Social Science and C. Lowell Harriss, President of the Robert Schalkenbach Foundation. At Philadelphia there is the president of the Henry George School, Edward J. Dodson. At Washington there are: Steven B. Cord of Common Ground and Walt Rybeck of the Center for Public Dialogue. At Salem, New Hampshire there is Richard Noyes, president of the International Union for Land Value Taxation and Free Trade, and editor of Common Ground's Groundswell. I enclose a pamphlet that has addresses and phone numbers.

I enclose some material related to the problems of poverty and affordable housing and local efforts to bring relief. It appears that local governments will take corrective action before the federal government does. And local action will get a tremendous boost when the national media will lift what appears to many of us to be a taboo on the issue of land policy.
